PARSON DROVE CLUB HISTORY

The club was properly established in the village of Parson Drove in 1921 by the headmaster of the local council school.[1] After World War II the club played in the Peterborough & District League and also started entering the FA Cup.[2] After winning Division One in 1948–49, the club were the first champions of its Premier Division in 1949–50. Although they were relegated later in the 1950s, the club won Division One again in 1959–60 and returned to the Premier Division.

Parson Drove saw a sustained period of success in the 1960s and 1970s, winning the Premier Division in 1966–67, 1967–68, 1968–69, 1969–70, 1970–71 and 1973–74. They also won the <u>Cambridgeshire Invitation Cup</u> in 1969–70 and 1972–73, as well as the Cambridgeshire Challenge Cup twice and the Peterborough Senior Cup four times. In the late 1970s and early 1980s the club began entering the FA Cup again and also played in the <u>FA Vase</u> for three seasons.[3] In the <u>1979–80 FA Cup</u> the club went on a remarkable run that included defeating <u>Southern League</u> clubs <u>Chelmsford City</u> and <u>King's Lynn,[3]</u> with the 2–0 win over Chelmsford labelled City's worst ever performance.[4] In 1988 they made a late application to join the new Division One of the <u>Eastern Counties</u> <u>League</u>, but were rejected.[5] With their ground in a poor state and a lack of interest from the public and players, the club was then disbanded.

On 2 March 1992 the club was resurrected following a meeting by village residents and re-entered the Peterborough & District League in Division Six. They returned to the Premier Division after winning Division One in 2003–04. Midway through the 2013–14 season, the club folded, and had their results expunged from the league. A new Parson Drove club was established in August 2017 when Peterborough & District League Division Two club Wisbech St Mary Saints (who had been formed earlier in the summer) moved to Parson Drove and were renamed to FC Parson Drove. [6] The new club went on to win the Division Two title, earning promotion to Division One, as well as the Cambridgeshire Junior Cup and the North Cambridgeshire Junior Cup.

The 2018–19 season saw Parson Drove win the Division One title, resulting in promotion to the Premier Division. At the end of the 2020–21 season the club were promoted to Division One North of the Eastern Counties League. [7] The reformed club entered the <u>FA Vase</u> for the first time in 2021–22.[8]



GORLESTON RESERVES CLUB HISTORY

Gorleston Football Club is considered to have been formed in 1884 but, it wasn't until 1905 following a merger with Gorleston St Andrews FC, that a Reserves side was created, initially called St Andrews FC.

St Andrews first trophy was in 1908, winning the Yarmouth & District League 2nd Division. At the end of that season, Gorleston successfully applied for senior club status and St Andrews became known as Gorleston Reserves.

The Reserves won the North Suffolk League in 1908/09, Yarmouth Borough League Division One in 1910/11 and, in 1931, the Norfolk Junior Cup for the first time. The Wiltshire Cup was won in 1933, the East Anglian League in 1953 and the Anglian Combination Reserve Cup in 1969. A second Junior Cup win came in 1973 and the third in 1978.

In 1976/77, the Reserves won the Anglian Combination Division Two, winning it again in 1980/81 followed by the Anglian Combination Division One title in 1982/83 and again in 2000/01. In 2005, a club Extraordinary General Meeting held on 16th December, decided, in preference to the First Team dropping out of their league, the Greens would scrap the Reserve team due to severe financial restraints.

The Reserves were reformed for the start of the 2007/08 season, playing in Anglian Combination Division 6 before switching to the Eastern Counties Reserve League. The Reserve League North was won in 2011/12, along with the Chell Trophy. In 2015/16, the Reserves re-joined the Anglian Combination League, going into Division 5 South, finishing champions and not losing en route. also winning the CS Morley Cup.

2016/17 saw the Reserves win Anglian Combination Division 4 and retain the CS Morley Cup. Anglian Combination Division 3 was won in 2017/18.

After the Covid seasons, in 2022/23, the Reserves finished runners up in Division 1 and were promoted to the Anglian Comb Premier Division and senior football.

2023/24 saw Gorleston Reserves settle at The Nest where they won the Anglian Combination Premier Division to gain promotion into the Thurlow Nunn First Division.

The Reserves made it four titles in a row in 2018/19, winning Anglian Comb Division 2, and gaining promotion to Division 1, also winning the Norfolk Junior Cup again. After the Covid seasons, in 2022/23, the Reserves finished runners up in Division 1 and were promoted to the Anglian Comb Premier Division and senior football.

2023/24 saw Gorleston Reserves settle at The Nest where they won the Anglian Combination Premier Division to gain promotion into the Thurlow Nunn First Division.
